

T's & C's for WBKA members selling at the Wiltshire Bee & Honey Day 2025

This is a golden opportunity for exhibitors and volunteers at the show to sell their honey and to show the public the best that Wiltshire beekeepers can produce. Therefore, all products must be attractively presented and legal for us to sell. We cannot accept cosmetics, alcoholic or non-honey edible products (sweets, biscuits, cakes etc).

The specific guidelines are below and all products are accepted at the Honey Show Organiser's and Honey Sales Manager's discretion.

- 1. Sellers must be a member of one of the four WBKA branches.
- 2. Sellers must be exhibiting at the Honey Show or helping out at the Wiltshire Bee and Honey Day 2025 as a steward or on the committee.
- 3. 10% commission will be payable to WBKA on all sales.
- 4. All proposed items for sale should be registered with the Honey Sales Manager by **4**th **October 2025** this will help speed up the registration process on the day.
- 5. Initially items for sale are restricted to 20 lb of Honey per member in total. For example,
 - a. 20lbs can be made up by a combination of 1lb,12oz and 8oz jars.
 - b. If insufficient offers of stock are received, then these amounts may be revisited.
- 6. Sellers will be issued with a receipt for products as brought for sale on the day.
- 7. Unsold items can be collected, together with a statement of sales, after 4pm on the day of the show.
 - a. Earlier collection can be arranged if requested in advance.
 - b. NB unless your box/container is marked clearly with your name, then the exact one may not be returned to you.
- 8. Payment by WBKA for honey and other products sold will be by bank transfer (or, exceptionally, by cheque) the following week, less 10% commission to the WBKA and less the credit card fee.
- 9. All honey must be in the sizes 227g, 340g and 454g (8oz, 12oz and 1lbs) and will be sold at a cost of £5, £7 and £9 respectively.
- 10. Pricing other items, please round up or down to the nearest 50p.
- 11. Any honey not fitting the above description must be priced on the packaging (cut comb, chunk honey, sections etc). For example, cut comb sells well around 40p/10g.
- 12. All honey must be labelled according to current honey regulations (see link) and the seller must be identifiable from the label which must be stuck to the jar by means of an adhesive label. Tags tied to the jar will not be accepted. For full details of what Wiltshire Trading Standards will accept, find details of label specifications here: https://bit.ly/honeylabels
- 13. All other hive products must be labelled with seller's details (name and postcode minimum) and expected price.
- 14. No cosmetic, alcoholic or edible products (other than honey) will be accepted.
- 15. While every care will be taken, all products are presented for sale at the seller's risk.
